Message from the Village President



Dear Residents of River Forest,

On behalf of the Board of Trustees, I'd like to thank all of you for watching or participating in our annual Memorial Day parade on May 30. The event included wonderful weather, great food and music. I'd also like to thank the River Forest Service Club and all of the sponsors who made the event possible. It was an inspirational way to honor the brave men and women who serve our country.

This summer the Village Board will be working on a few important economic development initiatives.

First, the process of redeveloping Lake and Lathrop will start this summer when a planned development application is compiled and submitted to the Development Review Board for review and consideration. A [redevelopment agreement](#) was approved in late March, 2016, to remove contaminated soil underneath certain buildings and areas in the parkway near this intersection. Removal of the contamination will be done effectively and safely. This redevelopment effort will become an important part of our

economic landscape as we look ahead to begin rejuvenating our business district along Lake Street.

In addition, the Village Board will begin negotiating the redevelopment agreement with Keystone Ventures for the Village-owned property at the corner of Lake and Park.

The most exciting initiative before us is the establishment of the Madison Street TIF (Tax Increment Finance) District. The Village Board began examining the creation of a TIF District two years ago to expand the Village's tax base by redeveloping commercial properties. We continue to believe that a TIF District will benefit our community greatly by stabilizing our residential property tax burden and improving our quality of life. A TIF District on Madison Street will also enable existing businesses to improve their buildings, attract new businesses, and create opportunities for new shopping and dining destinations.

To keep you apprised of the process of considering the TIF District creation, and respond to the myriad of questions you may have, the Village will communicate with you more regularly about the reasons for considering this redevelopment tool. The Village will also add a list of FAQs (Frequently Asked Questions) on a section of the Village's website dedicated to the [Madison Street TIF \(click here to access the page\)](#). Information will be updated regularly with reports, audio recordings of public meetings and other websites you can use to obtain other pertinent material. We encourage you to look at materials on our website and other sites that offer relevant information. We also urge you to read the letters we will send to you. Residents with relevant, factual information can help frame and move the debate forward.

Scheduled meetings, all of which will be open to the public, will be posted on the community calendar. On June 27 the Village Board of Trustees and I will meet to hear residents' concerns and discuss the TIF District. The Village will hold another meeting in July during which residents have an opportunity to comment. Trustees are scheduled to vote on the TIF District in early August.

The Village Board and I encourage open communication and discussion on any topic. Please reach out to your elected officials and Village Staff if you have other questions or concerns.

Please join me in welcoming the new principal at St. Luke Parish Elementary School, Timothy J. Wesley. River Forest's excellent educational institutions continue to attract educators with credentials like Principal Wesley's and we look forward to welcoming him to the community.

Vehicle stickers are now available for purchase and must be affixed to your windshield by July 14 to avoid late fees and citations.

All vehicles registered in the State of Illinois with a River Forest address must also be registered with the Village through the purchase of a vehicle sticker license. Payment may be made as follows:

- By mail using the envelope received from the Village (the application can also be downloaded [here](#)).
- In person at the Village Hall during regular business hours or after hours using the drop box located outside the Village Hall.

Historic Preservation Ordinance Flow Charts

You've probably heard that River Forest's Historic Preservation Ordinance was recently updated. The most significant changes affect owners of significant properties.

- 1) The Historic Preservation Commission (HPC) will now review appropriateness of proposed window replacement for significant properties within 7 days.
- 2) The HPC now has the ability to delay demolition of significant properties up to six months in order to explore other alternatives with the property owner.

The HPC received multiple requests from village residents to respond to both issues. The historic preservation ordinance is published on the village website. If you click on the below link, the last few pages of the published ordinance include flow chart reference diagrams for both changes:

Burglary and Theft Prevention Tips from the River Forest Police Department

As the weather warms up, River Forest and its surrounding areas have suffered a number of thefts and burglaries. The majority of these thefts and burglaries are preventable through basic practices. RFPD would like to remind residents of some strategies to prevent becoming a victim of theft.

-Always lock vehicles, whether they are parked outside or in a garage. This way, even if a garage door is inadvertently left open, access cannot be gained to the inside of the vehicle.

-Do not leave spare keys inside a vehicle. Cars made in the last fifteen years are nearly impossible to steal without a key or a tow truck. As such, cars are rarely stolen in our area, but when they are, it is typically because the thief had access to the vehicle's key.

-When investigating vehicle burglaries, we are occasionally told by victims that they left the vehicle doors unlocked so that a criminal would not damage their windows or doors to steal items. However, it is very rare for offenders in our area to damage vehicles to steal items as it greatly increases their likelihood of getting caught.

-In the rare event an offender damages the vehicle to gain entry, it is because the vehicle contains valuables visible from outside. As such, do not leave valuable items (including GPS devices) in your vehicle. If you must leave valuables in your vehicle, make sure they are out of plain view from the outside.

-Keep garage doors closed and/or locked, even when you are home. We have seen cases where items were stolen from an open garage unbeknownst to homeowners inside the home.

-Invest in a quality bike lock, and keep your bikes locked even when parked inside your garage, yard, or house. U-Locks seem to be the strongest; avoid flexible rope or chain locks as they can be easily cut.

-Register your bike with the village. It is not required, but it is free, easy, and will help us recover your bike if it is lost or stolen.

-If your home is equipped with an alarm system, activate it when you leave home and consider activating a "stay" function (exterior alarmed but no interior motion detectors) when you are in bed. Keep windows and doors closed and locked when you are out of the home or in bed.

Know the Code!

The Village would like to remind all residents to be mindful when disposing of yard waste. The collection requirements for yard waste includes the following ([see Village Code Title 6, Chapter 3](#)):

- "Yard waste" is trees or tree branches (not exceeding four inches in diameter), brush, plant stalks and shrubs cut up and bound into bundles of no more than four feet in length and fifty pounds in weight, which bundles shall be bound with biodegradable twine and shall have one universal solid waste tag affixed to each bundle. Yard waste is also grass clippings, leaves, twigs, weeds and all other materials of similar nature placed in biodegradable paper bags (up to thirty two gallons in capacity) as described in section 6-3-1 of this chapter affixed with one universal solid waste tag. It shall be unlawful for any person to mix yard waste with other garbage and refuse.
- For non-alley collections, properly packaged yard waste will be picked up "curbside", as defined in section 6-3-1 of this chapter. Materials placed for such collection shall not be put out prior to 6:00 PM on Monday (the day before yard waste collection) and will be picked up on Tuesday. For alley collection, properly packaged yard waste shall be placed for collection next to the regular garbage collection point. It shall be unlawful to place yard waste within the street, alley or walkway.
