

PYD Analysis Framework



Problem statement:

13% of 8th grade students report they have used alcohol in the past 30 days, 23% of 10th graders report past 30 day use, and 44% of 12th graders report past 30 day use

OVERALL- 27% of 8th-12th graders report they have used alcohol in the past 30 days*

- Logic model(identifying key factors):
 - Retail access
 - Social access (provision by parents, provision by other adults, accessibility via parties
 - Permissive social norms (family norms, community norms, youth norms)
 - Low perceived risk (low risk of harm, low risk of consequences)

Baseline:

Comparison to state overall results. Our community is eligible for the Federal Grant because our results have historically been higher than the state averages



The Growing Need

Impact on persons with disease and caregivers

By 2025, the number of people age 65 and older with Alzheimer's disease and other dementias is estimated to reach 7.1 million — a 40 percent increase from the 5.1 million age 65 and older affected in 2015.



Nearly 60% of people with dementia live in their own community homes





1 in 7 live alone

Caregivers and families

In 2014 caregivers provided 17.9 billion hours of unpaid care, averaging 22 hours per week and valued at \$217.7 billion annually

The physical and emotional impact of dementia caregiving is estimated to have resulted in \$9.7 billion in health care costs in the United States in 2014



Dementia Friendly Illinois: Rationale

- ➤ Almost 220,000 people in Illinois have dementia due to Alzheimer's disease.
- ➤ By 2025 the number will increase by 18% to 260,000 people.
- ➤ Each person with dementia has multiple informal caregivers -- another 588,000 persons living in Illinois are impacted by dementia.




Dementia Friendly Illinois: Rationale












Hit & Run /Injury Accidents By Timeframe:

Incident Summary

On January 7th, 2019, at 5:48pm, a resident was in their car in their driveway in the 500 block of Auvergne Place (near Lake Street) when a subject approached the driver-side door, pointed a handgun at the victim, and pulled on the door handle. The subject was described as an unknown male, approximately 5'9", wearing a full black "ski mask", white hooded sweat-shirt, blue jeans with tears in the legs, and white gym shoes. The subject then ran northbound on Auvergne. The victim immediately called 911 and River Forest units searched the area but did not locate the subject.

If you are the victim of a carjacking, the safety of you and your passengers is the priority. Do not argue or fight with the carjacker. Leave the car and your belongings and call 911 immediately if your phone is on your person. If you can gather a description of the vehicle, offenders or suspects, please relay that information to the 911 dispatcher. But remember, your safety and the safety of your passengers come first!

As always, please call 911 to report any suspicious activity in your neighborhood.
