### Message from the Village President



Dear River Forest Residents,

Welcome to July. I hope you all have a safe and wonderful Independence Day.

#### Here is what happened at our June Board Meeting...

The Trustees and I had an informative presentation on June 24 regarding deer and other wildlife that are increasingly wandering through our neighborhoods. Click [here](#) to watch the presentation.

By a unanimous vote, River Forest adopted the state law raising the minimum age to purchase tobacco products to 21. An ordinance adopted by Trustees also will raise the minimum age for possession of tobacco products to 21. This is a public health issue that affects us all.

Much of the rest of the newsletter will be devoted to addressing how River Forest will become an age-friendly community. We need to mold and weave this question throughout each and every facet of the community, into every unit of government and every public and private institution here in River Forest.

Let me explain what I mean by "age friendly." An age-friendly community enables people of all ages to actively participate in community activities and treats everyone with respect, regardless of age. It is a place that makes it easy for aging people to stay connected to those who are important to them. It also helps people stay healthy and active and provides appropriate support to those who can no longer look after themselves. For instance, aging residents may need:

- Housing alternatives if they can no longer maintain their property or they may need assistance with simple chores like raking leaves, shoveling snow from their sidewalks or completing simple home repairs.
- Transportation because they can't drive as much or as far.
- Special recreation facilities and parks if they are not designed for users of all ages.
- Emergency services, with increased calls, including from more residents with memory issues. This point alone is

the reason Trustees in February passed a resolution declaring River Forest a [Dementia-Friendly Community](#), making us the fifth governmental agency in Illinois to be so recognized by Dementia Friendly America. In March, I signed a [pledge](#) approved by Trustees to make River Forest a place for successful aging. This also



led us to foster an [ID bracelet program](#), which is intended to give public safety personnel a means of quickly locating necessary information to help residents in emergencies, while maintaining sensitivity and confidentiality of personal data. Firefighters, police officers and library employees also

have taken 'Dementia Live' training to understand what people with dementia can experience.

- Opportunities for outreach from younger generations and intergenerational activities so older adults can remain socially connected. This will prevent isolation.

Our demographics are changing and people are living longer. Adults over the age of 85 are growing faster than any other age group. By 2030, it is estimated that nearly 20% of the population will be older than 65. By 2050, it is estimated that more than 1 million Americans will be older than 100. By that year, which is when millennials will enter retirement age, many of their parents will still be alive. This is not just about the Baby Boomers; it's about all generations of our residents.

River Forest will be engaged in this vital enterprise. I am chairing a committee for the Metropolitan Mayors' Caucus that will define policies that can solidify these aims for us. Trustee Respicio Vazquez will head this initiative for us at the village level. Together, we will have a solid direction on where we should be going.

Our quarterly community crime prevention meeting will be at 6 p.m., July 24 at the River Forest Public Library. It is free and open to the public. We will also be live streaming the meeting on Facebook Live and the Village's website.

On July 9, the Sustainability Commission will be meeting with businesses to discuss the reduction of single-use plastic in River Forest in favor of more sustainable materials. This effort is in support of "Charlotte and McKenzie Reusable Bag Day" (July 9), a day so named in 2018 to recognize the efforts of two 8th graders from Roosevelt Middle School who advocated for the use of reusable materials in the lunchroom to divert waste and reduce single-use plastic.

Overnight parking will be allowed on Village streets from 12:01 AM Thursday, July 4, 2019 through 9:00 AM Monday, July 8, 2019. No overnight parking waivers will be required during this period. All other parking regulations remain in effect.

River Forest will be open for appeals with the Cook County Board of Review from July 1 - July 30. The River Forest Township will be hosting a Community Outreach meeting with the Board of Review on **Thursday, 7/25 at 6:00 PM** at the River Forest Community Center located at 8020 Madison St. Room 206. Please bring a tax bill with you and you will be able to submit your appeal to the Board of Review at the meeting. This appeal

period is starting over a month earlier than previous years. You can also appeal online at: [www.cookcountyboardofreview.com](http://www.cookcountyboardofreview.com). The Township Assessor office can assist with the appeal process.

The Township Assessor office will be extremely busy during the month of July. Appointments are necessary unless you come in during walk-in office hours: Thursday's 10:00 AM - 12:00 PM. Appointments are available throughout the week. Please call 708-366-2787 and leave your name, address, phone number twice and your concern.

## Fireworks Safety

The River Forest Fire Department and the Illinois State Fire Marshal recommends that fireworks be left to professionals for a safe Fourth of July celebration. Please click [here](#) for more information on fireworks safety.



Additionally, the [United States Consumer Product Safety Commission](#) has notified area Police and Fire departments of a potentially dangerous situation with fireworks and have issued a recalls for many firework products, including some sold in [Indiana](#) and [Michigan](#). Please stay safe this holiday and if you do choose to enjoy a firework show, leave it to professionals.

**Oak Park:** OPRF High School (201 Scoville Ave.)

**Forest Park:** Park District (7329 W. Harrison St.)

**Elmwood Park:** Elmwood Park High School (8201 W. Fullerton Ave.)

River Forest ordinances prohibit any person from using, selling, delivering, exploding or possessing fireworks in the village all year round. The term "fireworks" includes firecrackers, cherry bombs, M-80's, bottle rockets and Roman candles. Remember, the laws in Illinois do not change over the July 4 holiday or for any other holiday.

## Historic Preservation

The Historic Preservation Commission has extended its deadline for accepting applications for 2019 Historic Preservation Awards from homeowners, architects or contractors who have completed qualifying jobs in River Forest since January 1, 2014. **Nominations must be received on or before July 19, 2019.** For full details and an application, click [here](#).

## 2019-2020 Vehicle Stickers

Vehicle stickers for 2019-2020 are now available for purchase and must be affixed to your windshield by **July 14** to avoid late fees and citations. All vehicles registered in the State of Illinois with a River Forest address must also be registered with the Village through the purchase of a vehicle sticker license. Payment may be made as follows:

- Online at the Village Website by clicking [here](#).

By mail using the envelope received from the Village (the application can also be downloaded [here](#)).

- In person at the Village Hall during regular business hours or after hours using the drop box located outside the Village Hall.

Stickers are \$45 for passenger vehicles and \$25 for motorcycles, antique vehicles and senior citizens (one senior citizen vehicle sticker per household). Vehicle sticker applications were recently mailed. If you receive an application for a vehicle that you no longer own or a duplicate application, please notify the Village by either calling, or returning the application noting the vehicle's status in the enclosed envelope, so that the vehicle will be removed from our records.
