Message from the Village President



Dear River Forest Residents.

Welcome to June and a real summer.

Here's what happened at the Board Table in May

Village Trustees approved a new Comprehensive Plan after 18 months of study and discussion. This document sets forth long-range recommendations for the maintenance and enhancement of the community as well as desirable improvements, developments and redevelopments. In short, the plan will help set our future

course. A copy of the approved plan is available here.

In addition, the Board awarded a contract to Cordogan Clark and Associates, not to exceed \$25,000, to assess the structural viability of the Civic Center Authority building, better known as the River Forest Community Center, on Madison Street. This architect will help the Village, River Forest Township and Park District, and School Districts 200 and 90 determine how to maximize the facility's use for our community. Results of the study are due this fall.



Last year, the Village Board of Trustees honored 100-yearold Monica Affleck and passed a resolution designating February 12 as Monica Affleck Day. This year, with her passing, Trustees adopted a resolution giving the 300 block of Ashland Avenue the honorary designation of Monica Affleck Way. The sign is posted at the intersection of Ashland and Hawthorne. We cannot be more proud of the marvelous legacy she has left our community.

Erika Bachner, Katie Brennan and Bob O'Connell were sworn in as new Village Trustees. The Village Board also said farewell to Sue Conti, Carmela Corsini and Mike Gibbs, three Trustees who have played significant roles in making River Forest a better, more viable community. We will miss their institutional memory and their selfless service to the community.

Besides their roles as policy makers, Village Trustees will

be involved in important initiatives the Board will need to address in the next two years.

- Erika Bachner will lead the River Forest Complete Count Committee to ensure that every resident is counted in the 2020 Census. This effort is vital, for the information the Census collects helps determine how more than \$675 billion in federal and state funding is distributed to states and communities, including River Forest.
- Katie Brennan will be engaged with legislative matters that affect the Village by way of unfunded mandates from county, state and federal governments.
- Tom Cargie will continue as our representative to the subcommittee on collaboration, a collection of taxing bodies that work together to make governments more efficient. A good example is the River Forest Community Calendar, which is live at <u>RFHappenings.com</u>. The calendar is a great example of how working together makes a stronger, better informed community. I shared this accomplishment with mayors from around the country during a Mayors Innovation Project conference in Washington D.C., and it was well received.
- Patty Henek will be responsible for identifying how the Village can improve communication with residents.
- Bob O'Connell will work on initiatives involving the River Forest Civic Center Authority building, the public works building and economic development especially around the TIF districts.
- Respicio Vazquez will concentrate on age friendly and other initiatives for senior citizens.

Trustees will make reports as needed and these will be available on the Village's website and Facebook page.

The Village also welcomed its newest firefighter Joshua McNabb. The Village Board and I are always pleased to swear-in these new public servants and have a chance to welcome them and their families to the community.

Congratulations to our Village Administrator Eric Palm for being awarded the Jack Williams Award for outstanding leadership in intergovernmental cooperation. This award is



given annually by the West Central Municipal Conference to an elected official or appointed representative.

2019-2020 Vehicle Stickers

Vehicle stickers for 2019-2020 are now available for purchase and must be affixed to your windshield by **July 14** to avoid late fees and citations. All vehicles registered in the State of Illinois with a River Forest address must also be registered with the Village through the purchase of a vehicle sticker license. Payment may be made as follows:

- Online at the Village Website by clicking here.
- By mail using the envelope received from the Village (the application can also be downloaded here).
- In person at the Village Hall during regular business hours or after hours using the drop box located outside the Village Hall.

Stickers are \$45 for passenger vehicles and \$25 for motorcycles, antique vehicles and senior citizens (one senior citizen vehicle sticker per household). Vehicle sticker applications were recently mailed. If you receive an application for a vehicle that you no longer own or a duplicate application, please notify the Village by either calling, or returning the application noting the vehicle's status in the enclosed envelope, so that the vehicle will be removed from our records.
